- PAC Report (Parent Advisory Council)

  - o Goal this year has been to increase awareness, which is what led to the Soccer Social.

  - o Finances
    - Internal Accounts
      - No major changes
    - Buckets
      - -\$656.64 negative was cleared, negative because of the hours they worked that particular pay period
      - Should have sufficient funds to carry us through the end of the year and compensation for educators work completed between the last day of school and 6/30
    - Non Payroll Lines
      - All orders must be placed by 5/27/22
      - \$8,670 non-discretionary funds (additional CPS allocation) will be used for end of year celebrations
      - CTU funds are included here (\$250 per teacher, teachers can submit for reimbursement from these funds, approx \$2,000 passed to school by teachers, remainder unused will return)
      - \$26,358.50 Moving Forward Together Funds
      - \$18,800 STEAM for Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Training, Tech: Computers for teachers and Smartboards
        - MM: How many additional Smartboards needed so everyone has one? YN: Not sure right now, bought 8 this year, prioritized based on need, will get numbers, training comes along with smartboards. JB shares they are very useful tools, whole kinder team got them this year.
        - Skyline: primary educators trialing Skyline math (district created curriculum) and 8th grade ELA trialed some units. Bridges and

Envision both being considered. Need to support ELL, teacher development and differentiation.

### Attendance

- 92%, close to district average
- COVID cases have been very high
- Celebrations focusing on being in school rather than perfect attendance

  - When 2 or more cases in one homeroom, send letter requiring masking. If student is unmasked, student must remain in care room. Enforcement is challenging.
  - Vaccine clinic at Peterson today, if approved, understand that boosters will be available for 5 and up at next clinic on June 8th. Students can receive vaccination without parent present if they give consent/register ahead of time.
