- Student Voice Committee Reports
 - Presented by Rosemary and Joan (students)
 - Lists of projects that are feasible; ideas included purified water, better toilet paper, cozy corner on 1st floor, cleaner bathrooms, more organized recess activities, safer hallways, new supplies for recess and gym, healthier lunch options
 - They will decide what to move forward with based on what they have more control over. They especially like cozy corner idea.
 - 6-8th have been going through similar process to make them feel safer/improve school, including flexible seating at lunch, playground equipment, food options at lunch
 - They have begun prioritizing based on rank choice options;
 leaning towards food, clothing, hygiene drive b/c they liked the impact it can have.
- PAC Report (Parent Advisory Council)
 - Catherine Literacy Night very successful last month; SEL and family night tomorrow
- BAC Report (Bilingual Advisory Committee)
 - No separate report this evening
- Principal's Report
 - Cultivate Survey (5th-8th grade) to assess experience, mindset and get info to act on related to learning environment; 9 main components; Yalil shared a few sample questions (from principal report deck)
 - 95% completion rate
 - Results Feedback for Growth (diving into mistakes, analyzing as opportunities for growth), Student Voice (student choice) and Classroom Communities (student-centered discussion, listen/learn, share to build trust and vulnerability) are biggest opportunities for improvement; (Noted Affirming Identities was not high on list meaning, we are doing a good job with this topic area!)
 - Sulayman feedback accurate to student perception and feeling on what to improve/what's going well
 - School Climate & Culture school norms are a priority (along with student voice) to create safe space
 - Staff survey 19 responses (see principal report deck for detailed results)
 - 3rd-8th grade norms survey went out this week (what do you want to see, any other feedback they wish to share)
 94 responses so far
 - Pre-K Expansion preliminary interest in positions (teacher and teacher assistant for each classroom); parent applications open 4/11; hope to positively impact enrollment for future grades with

- this expansion; reason for expansion is district determined this area needed more pre-k seats; expect that we'll get more neighborhood kids coming for pre-k and staying because this is a full-day program; those who live here and apply will receive priority on enrollment acceptance; Maleeha asked how many eligible we will have in the neighborhood next year-Yalil to investigate
- IAR (IL Assessment of Readiness) assess whether students can
 do grade level work; test window opened this week; more info to
 come from teachers in coming weeks (schedule is being planned
 currently); testing window likely after returning from spring break to
 maximize time of instruction prior to assessment; will provide tips
 for parents to help students prepare to the best of their abilities
 - Student refusal policy students are expected and encouraged to participate in this state assessment; letter to school isn't necessary or "allowed" but if student refuses, they will engage in other activity like a reading or hw assignment; Ms. Zodo said teachers also reinforce that this is good practice for their future since many assessments in their future throughout school/career, etc.
- Likely to be 3 Kindergarten homerooms next year, based on enrollment monitoring
- Friends of Peterson Updates Fundraising request to have another walk-a-thon, partner with PTA (35K raised last year; this year goal of 30K); seeking business sponsors, sell t-shirts, have kids work to raise funds - will run til end of May
