## Why does attendance

## matter?

- Students with good attendance are far more likely to be successful in school.
- High attendance rates are linked to high student achievement, and this is true for elementary, middle, and high school students.
- Missing school causes children to fall behind academically.
- Attendance matters for Peterson as well: Attendance accounts for twenty percent (20\%) of our rating under Chicago Public Schools' School Quality Rating Policy (SQRP). ## How does Peterson support

 attendance for all students?- Each week, any homeroom with $98 \%$ attendance or greater receives recognition over the loudspeaker and an attendance trophy.
- Homerooms with $97 \%$ attendance or greater receive recognition over the loudspeaker.
- Each quarter, homerooms with $97 \%$ attendance or better earn snack and story time or a pizza party depending on the grade level of the homeroom.
- Students with perfect attendance for the quarter (no absences and no tardies) receive recognition and a perfect attendance ribbon at the quarterly award ceremony.

## What do I do if my child is absent?

Three Important Questions to Ask:

1. Does the child's illness keep him or her from comfortably taking part in activities?
2. Does the sick child need more care than the staff can give without affecting the health and safety of other children?
3. Could the other children get sick from being near your child?
If the answer to any of these questions is yes, then the child should NOT go to school.
According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, the following conditions or symptoms DO NOT REQUIRE EXCLUSION from school:common colds; a cough not associated with an infectious disease; a fever (temperature above 101 F taken orally) without any signs or symptoms of illness; or a rash without fever and behavioral changes.

- If your child is sick, please call the school at 773-534-5070 Ext. 18428 before 8:30am if you know your child will be absent. You may leave a message if no one answers.
- Please include your child's first and last name, room number or teacher's name, and reason for absence. Otherwise, we will need to call you regarding the absence.
- You will also receive an automated call from CPS regarding the absence.
- You must send the "Reason for Absence Note" to your child's teacher regarding any absence or early dismissal upon their return to class.
