## Definitions and Scoring

General Terms

School Quality Rating

School Accountability Status



The School Quality Rating is the rating assigned to the school based on its performance on the SQRP indicators during the 2018-2019 school year. The ratings range from Level $1+$ (highest) to Level 3 (lowest). The school receives between 1 and 5 points for each indicator, which are then multiplied by that indicator's weight to calculate the weighted points for each indicator. The weighted points the school receives for each indicator are then added together to calculate an overall weighted score, which also falls between 1 and 5 .

This is the status that the school is assigned for the 2018-2019 school year. The accountability status is based on the School Quality Rating the school receives, as well as its accountability status history. A school can be in Good Standing, Provisional Support, or Intensive Support. When a school is in Provisional Support or Intensive Support, the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/34-8.3) grants the Board of Education and the CEO the authority to take steps to intervene in the school in order to improve the school's academic performance.
The Northwest Evaluation Association Measure of Academic Progress (NWEA MAP) is CPS's primary assessment measure for students in grades 2 through 8. The NWEA MAP is administered in the spring of each school year district-wide, and optionally in schools in the middle of the school year. The results are used at the classroom level to track students' progress toward learning goals and to tailor instruction to individual students. ACCESS for ELs is a secure large-scale English language proficiency assessment given to kindergarteners through 12th graders who have been identified as English Learners. In SY16, the ACCESS assessment was updated and new norms are not yet available. Therefore, growth could not be calculated for 2017-2018. These Board requirements are outlined in the School Quality Rating Policy.
Under section 105 ILCS 5/34-8.3 of the Illinois School Code, charter schools do not receive an Accountability Status. Charter accountability is defined by the terms of their contracts with the Board.
